1 Corinthians 13 & 14

In addressing the division that arose out of the improper use of gifts (tongues, in particular), Paul urged them to **purse love** as the **higher virtue** & **desire gifts** that will **greatly benefit the church** (& unbelievers), promoting edification, consideration & orderliness

1. Paul reiterates how one's ability (& even charity & sacrificial acts), if not accompanied with love, render him & what he does useless (13:1-3)

Ch 6

If I speak in the tongues of men & of angels...And if I have prophetic powers, & understand all mysteries & all knowledge...but have not love, vI am nothing. If I give away all I have, & if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. (v.1-3)

2. Love is not self-directed; what is loving always goes with what is right & true (13:4-7)

Love is patient & kind...It **does not insist on its own way**...it does **not rejoice at wrongdoing**, but **rejoices with the truth**. (v.4-6)

3. Love, unlike knowledge, prophesy or tongues which would cease after serving its purpose, is never-ending; it supersedes faith & hope (13:8-13)

Love never ends. As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away. (13:8)

So now faith, hope, & love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love. (13:13)

4. Paul appeals to them to pursue love & desire gifts (in particular, prophesy over tongues) to build up the church, & not just themselves (14:1-5)

Pursue love, & earnestly desire the spiritual gifts, especially that you may prophesy...the one who prophesies builds up the church...The one who prophesies is greater than the one who speaks in tongues (14:1, 4-5)

5. With specific reference to tongues,

a. if it is unintelligible, it is neither meaningful nor useful to build up the church (14:6-19)

if I come to you speaking in tongues, **how will I benefit you** unless I bring you some revelation or knowledge or prophecy or teaching? Nevertheless, in church I would **rather speak five words with my mind** in order to instruct others, than ten thousand words in a tongue. (14:6, 19)

b. it is a sign for the unbelievers; nevertheless, it still needs to be understandable for them to respond (14:20-25)

Thus tongues are a **sign...for unbelievers**...If, therefore, the whole church comes together & all speak in tongues, & outsiders or **unbelievers** enter, will they not say that **you are out of your minds**? (14:22-23)

6. Paul emphasized the importance of the building up of the church when Q8-9 they come together; which is achieved when they seek to promote good understanding, judgment, accountability, decorum & orderliness (14:26-40)

For **God** is not a God of confusion but **of peace.**(Apply)

But all things should be **done decently** & **in order**. (14:33, 40)
